

HIV Treaters Case Conference

2022-2024 Series

Description

The HIV Treaters Case Conference Meetings are an ongoing series of one-hour case discussions focused on HIV infection. HIV treating clinicians present two cases at each meeting for discussion by the group. Sites are connected in real-time via Zoom video conference technologies. Intended Audience

The target audiences for this activity are Wisconsin physicians, advance practice nurses, physician assistants, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, case managers, and dentists who provide care to individuals with HIV infection. The clinician participants include both primary care providers and HIV or infectious disease specialists. The audience includes both UW and non-UW clinicians, staff and clinical trainees.

Note: In order to preserve the legal protections afforded the peer review process, attendance at case conferences is limited to clinical providers who can contribute clinically and professionally.

Objectives

As a result of participation in this educational regularly scheduled series, learners will be able to:

1. Apply new or improved skills related to the complex medical issues and recommended patient-centered treatment strategies for individuals with HIV infection or at risk for HIV infection.
2. Recall the roles, responsibilities, and contributions of each HIV care team member in providing patient-centered care that addresses health disparities and values diversity.
3. Recognize the importance of interprofessional collaboration, teamwork, communication, shared decision-making, and professionalism in the service of providing high quality patient-centered care.
